UP Through the Centuries



The Jesuit Academy and University in Olomouc

The first members of the Jesuit Order, with the permission of Pope Pius V, established a college in Olomouc and began missionary, preaching, and teaching activities. Olomouc became a university town. Emperor Maximilian I granted the Olomouc College of the Society of Jesus graduation rights, making it a fully fledged university with two faculties – philosophical and theological.

1773–1782

Imperial-Royal Lyceum in Olomouc

The university is again transferred from Brno to Olomouc, but only as a lyceum, with limited graduation rights. As part of the state reform, Emperor Joseph I allows universities only in Vienna, Prague, and Lvov. The school is expanded to include medical-surgical studies (with German as the language of instruction). In 1806, the teaching of midwifery began to be taught in the Czech Lands. Three years later, the Institute of Medicine-Surgery is founded at the Forensic Medical Institute. In 1816, institutes of obstetrics, specialised therapies, and veterinary medicine are established in Olomouc.



1573–1773

Imperial–Royal University in Olomouc (and Brno)

Olomouc is gradually transformed into a border citadel due to the long-term conflict between the Habsburg Empire and Prussia. The number of soldiers in the city increases dramatically and the reorganised state university, the rectory, and the students' dormitory is moved to Brno, which was more conveniently located.

1827–1860

Independent Faculty of Theology

Shortly after the establishment of the Czechoslovak Republic, during a time of tense relations between the new state establishment and the Vatican, the name of the faculty is changed to the Cyril and Methodius Theological Faculty. In 1939, the faculty is closed by the Nazis.



1939–1945

Imperial-Royal Franz University Olomouc

Emperor Franz I of Austria promotes the Olomouc Lyceum again to a full university. The restored university has three faculties: philosophy, law, and theology. In 1834, an academic senate is elected for the first time. Gradually all faculties are abolished and the priceless university insignia are transferred to the Moravian Governorate in Brno and subsequently to the University of Innsbruck.

World War II

Czech universities are closed by the German Nazi occupation authorities.

Post-war Re-establishment

The Czechoslovak Parliament enacts a law to re-establish the University of Olomouc under a new name – Palacký University. The University of Education merges with Palacký University. This included the Faculty of Medicine, the Faculty of Social Sciences, and the Faculty of Natural Sciences, which were renamed the following year as the Philosophical Faculty and the Faculty of Science.

1945–1989

The Post-Velvet Revolution Boom

The Faculty of Theology and the Faculty of Law are restored, and the Faculty of Physical Culture and the Faculty of Health Sciences are opened. The university is thriving and expanding. New facilities are built and academics and research advance to the international level. Palacký University is for the first time ranked among the 500 best universities in the world. The Institute of Molecular and Translational Medicine and the CATRIN Scientific Institute are established.

Gregor Johann Mendel

Biologist from a German-speaking family, founder of genetics and discoverer of the basic laws of heredity; mathematician, botanist and meteorologist.



Bohdan Pomahač

Czech plastic surgeon who led the team that performed the first full face transplant in the United States. In 2017, he was appointed professor of surgery at Harvard Medical School.



Josef Jařab

Internationally renowned literary scholar, Americanist, and translator who focussed on the history of American literature with special attention to Black writing and its place in the North American cultural context.

Helena Suková

One of the most successful tennis players in Czechoslovakia, a women's doubles world number one, winner of fourteen Grand Slam titles, and a champion of the Doubles Championships. She secured 10 singles titles and 69 doubles titles on the WTA circuit. In women's doubles, alongside Jana Novotná, they won two silver medals at the Summer Olympic Games in 1988 and 1996. In 2010, she obtained the PhDr. degree after completing her studies in psychology at the Department of Psychology, Faculty of Arts.


