

Urban Mobility and Sustainable Business Models of Public and Private Companies in Iceland *Prof. Lara Johannsdottir (University of Iceland)*

The lecture will focus on urban mobility in the capital area of Reykjavík Iceland, and public transportation to and from the international airport of Keflavík. The focus will be on three companies, one publicly owned and two privately owned, and how their views toward sustainability. So-called, Five C framework, highlighting commitment, configuration, core business, communication, and continuous improvements, brights attention to how these companies try to integrate sustainability- aspects into their core business, what driving forces for companies proactiveness are relevant and what barriers the companies' need to overcome to operationalise sustainability in their strategies and daily operations. The lecture is also grounded on ideas about Industry and Society 5.0, and extended stakeholder engagement.

What is the Aurora Fellowship?

The Aurora Fellowship is a two-week programme that we were able to establish with the support of the Förderverein der Universität Duisburg-Essen Duisburg-Essen's University of sponsorship association). The aim of this programme is to invite internationally renowned researchers working within the Aurora European Universities Alliance to UDE, allowing them to engage in intensive exchange with our University's researchers. doctoral candidates, postdocs and students. The focus is on a different one of the four pilot domains each semester. This was started off with 'Culture: Diversities & Identities' in the winter semester 2022/23. In the summer semester 2023, the focus lies on Sustainability and Climate Change.



Dr. Lara Johannsdottir is a professor in the Environment and Natural Resources Graduate Programme, situated at the Faculty of Business Administration at the University of Iceland. She is the former academic director of the programme. Professor Johannsdottir has significant management and specialist experience from financial sector (insurance/pension fund). Her areas of research include corporate social responsibility sustainability. implementation, strategy Arctic-relevant topics. insurance. systemic risk. Lara has published dozens of book chapters and articles in leading journals and published a book by Routledge focusing on Corporate Social Responsibility in the Arctic, co-authored by Professor Gisele M. Arruda from the University of Aberdeen. Lara was a Fulbright Arctic Initiative Scholar from 2018-2019. She furthermore takes part in national and international research projects.
